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

The Criminal Justice programs at SSC are designed for those individuals either desiring employment with, or upgrading of their skills for police agencies, correctional facilities, or security companies. Theoretical and practical coursework is provided for maximum flexibility in career choice.

The field of law enforcement and criminal justice is an exciting and rewarding career choice for those who desire to find employment in a field which offers variety and new challenges on a daily basis. Individuals involved in this field will have the opportunity to make contributions to their community as well as society as a whole.

All students must demonstrate a minimum math competency equivalent to MTH 095 to enter SSC's Criminal Justice programs including Associate Degree and Certificate tracks. In addition, SSC offers a wide variety of courses specifically designed for transfer. This enables students to complete their first two years of coursework leading toward a Bachelor's Degree in virtually any field of study at a four-year college or university. (SSC offers a "2 plus 2" B.A. Degree option in Criminal Justice in conjunction with University of St. Francis.) The keys to transfer success are to start planning immediately and to select coursework carefully. SSC counselors and academic advisors are available to help students develop their Master Academic Plan (MAP).
