The SSCF hosted a National Day of Giving event – Rocky Clark Memorial Scholarship Fundraiser – sponsored by college Chairman Frank M. Zuccarelli, Thornton Township, and Illinois State Senator Napoleon Harris. The event raised over \$6,000 for students with challenges, which the Foundation matched. The fund was created following the passing of former student Rocky Clark on January 5, 2012. Rocky had been paralyzed from the neck down after a spinal cord injury in 2000. His injury was a result of a tackle which occurred during a football game at Eisenhower High School against Oak Forest. He spent the next eleven years nearly prone in a wheel chair. Rocky Clark began as a freshman at SSC in the spring of 2004 and last attended in the spring of 2007. He was an inspirational to all he came in contact with and was the first recipient of the Walter Payton Scholarship.

South Suburban College President Dr. Lynette Stokes Appointed to Illinois Community College Board

The Illinois Community College Board (ICCB) recently announced the appointment of SSC President, Lynette D. Stokes, Ed.D. to its board. Dr. Stokes was one of just two new statewide appointments along with Dr. Larry Peterson, former President of Shawnee Community College, whom upon confirmation from the Senate will serve terms through June 30, 2021.

“It is truly an honor to be chosen by the Illinois Community College Board and a privilege to represent South Suburban College and my colleagues statewide during this critical time,” said Dr. Stokes. “I would like to thank the ICCB for the opportunity, as well as Governor J.B. Pritzker and Deputy Governor of Education Jesse Ruiz for their tireless efforts on behalf of education. They understand the critical role of community colleges, such as South Suburban College, in providing equitable opportunities to our community. I look forward to getting to work over the next year to address the challenges of the times and to advocate for our students.”



Having worked in public service for over 20 years, Dr. Stokes joined SSC in June 2013 as the Vice President of Academic Services and was named President on October 1, 2018. She currently serves as Ex-Officio of the SSC Foundation Board. Dr. Stokes has the proud distinction of being the first female president in the college’s 91-year rich history.

Dr. Stokes has served as an advocate of youth in the child welfare system, taught elementary and community college education, and worked for equal rights organizations. She was the 2005 recipient of Roosevelt University’s Most Outstanding Dissertation of the Year; the 2009 recipient of the Kathy Osterman Award for Outstanding Supervisor given to public service employees in the City of Chicago; and 2014 recipient of the Chicago Defender’s Women of Excellence Award. In 2018 she was honored with the Egretta Education Award for Excellence in Education and the Illinois Committee on Black Concerns in Higher Education (ICBCHE) Trailblazer Award. In 2020 Dr. Stokes was awarded the MLK Excellence in Education Award by the Southland Ministerial Health Network.

Foundation Welcomes New Manager, Rebecca Garcia

SSC Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) graduates were not deterred by the pandemic, in more ways than one.



South Suburban College recently honored the 2020 graduates of the ADN Program with a special socially distanced ceremony. The graduates received their nursing pins from Dr. Tasha Williams, Vice President of Academic Services, and Dr. Linda Brown-Aldridge, who completed her first full academic year as the Dean of Nursing at SSC.

"The graduates' dedication, hard work, and resilience is inspiring, especially with the challenge of COVID-19 during the spring semester," said Dr. Brown-Aldridge. "The faculty and staff worked hard with the students to provide the needed support for their success during the pandemic."

When she joined SSC in spring of 2019, Dr. Brown-Aldridge brought more than 30 years of experience working in hospitals and schools in many roles including nursing, teaching, administration and serving as the Chief Nursing Officer at Provident Hospital. She has worked hard with Dr. Williams and her team to position the revitalized program for significant growth. The program admitted 42 new first year Nursing students for the Fall 2020 Semester, the largest class in several years. Dr. Brown-Aldridge was also recently appointed to the University of Chicago Ingalls Memorial Community Advisory Council.

"I am dedicated to growing this nursing program to address the health disparities and nursing shortage for our community," added Dr. Brown-Aldridge. "The decision to come to SSC was life changing for me. Working with the great administration, faculty, staff and students this past year has been very rewarding and fulfilling."

The next admission cycle opens October 1st 2020 to March 1st 2021 for the class to begin Fall 2021.

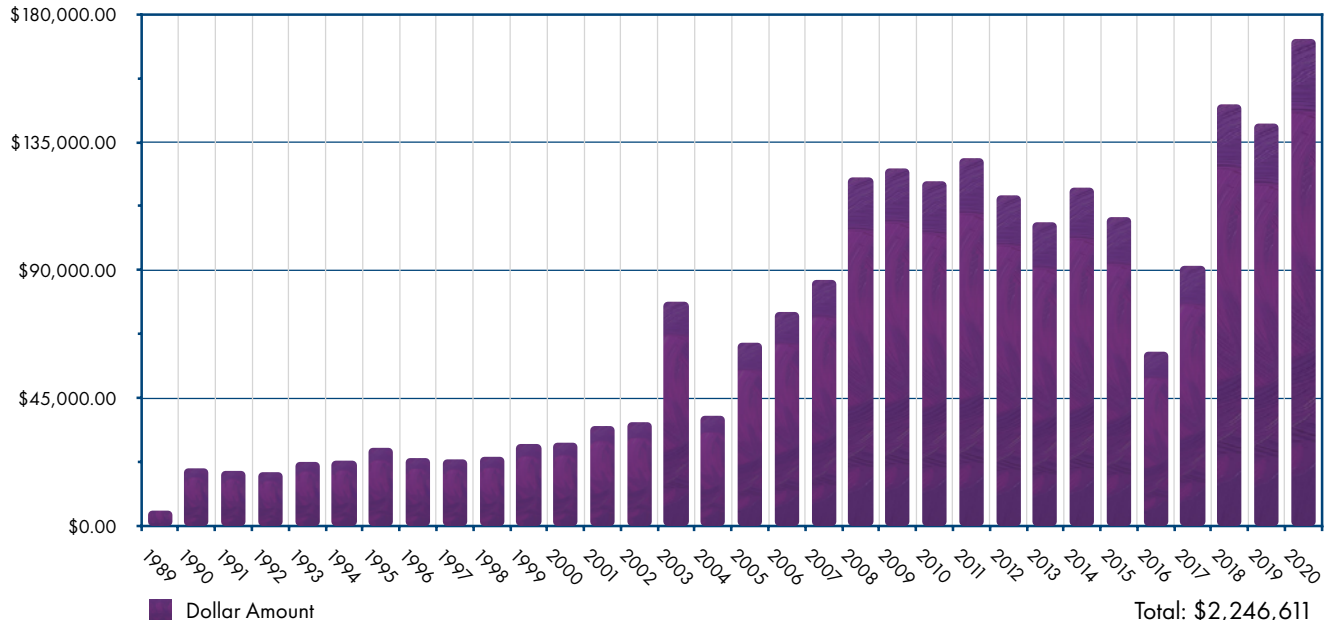

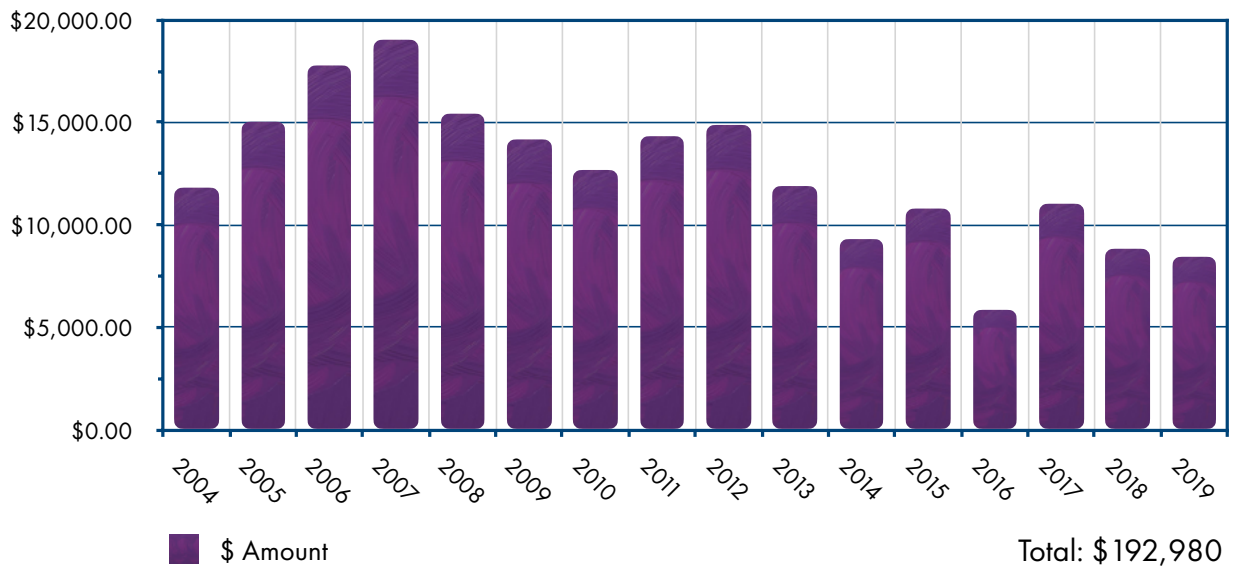

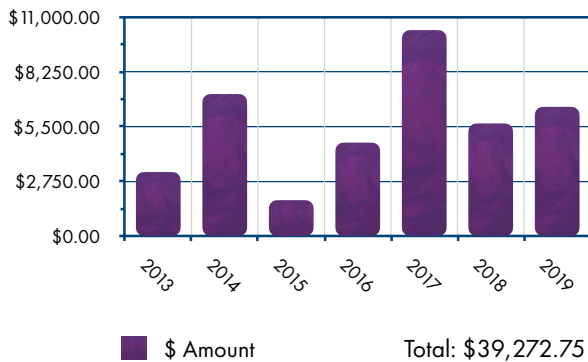
Dollar Amount of Academic Scholarships Awarded, 1989-2019



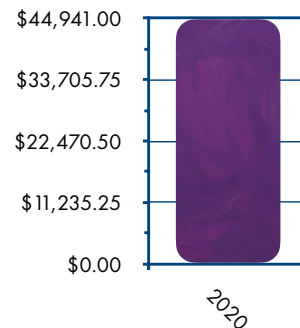
Carol Manning Student Assistance Fund Scholarships Dollar Amounts



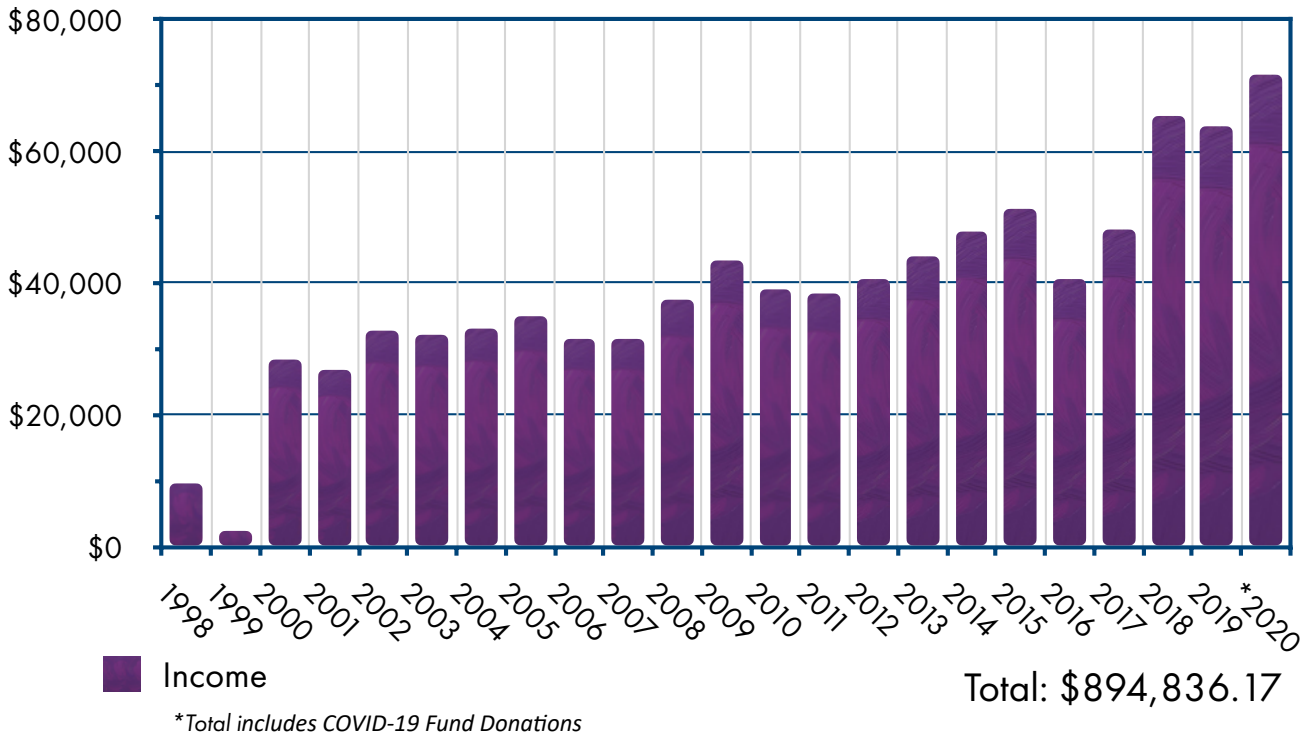
Rocky Clark (Students With Challenges) Scholarship Dollar Amounts



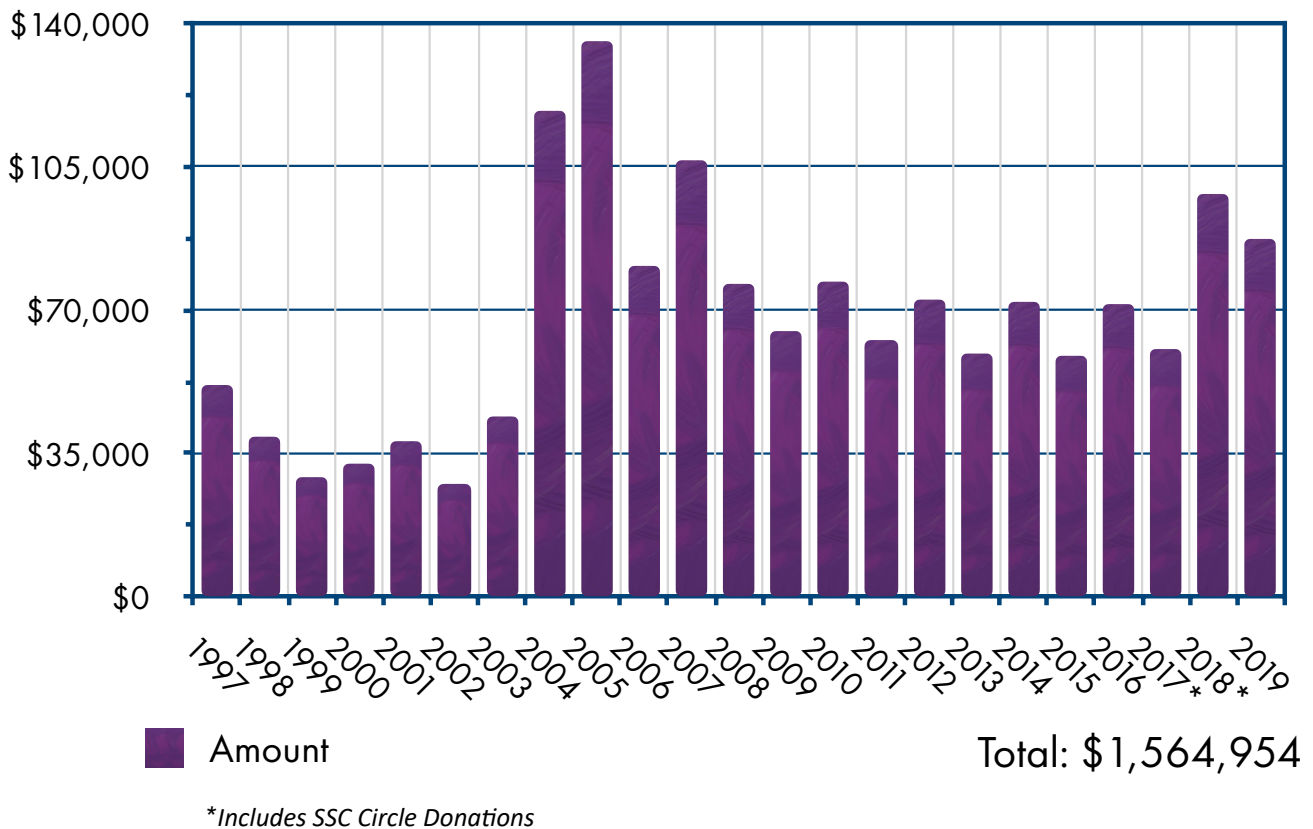

Phyallen Chaney



At the front lines of the COVID-19 pandemic stands Phyallen Chaney, an SSC student and emergency room customer service registration clerk. Phyallen, a 36-year old resident of Markham, IL, is often the first face a person sees when they are walking up for a coronavirus test under the University of Illinois (UIC) Medical Center tents.

“We are truly the first line of defense because nurses can’t even touch a patient until my team enters them into the system and acquires all of the information necessary to start the process,” said Phyallen.

Surrounded by people covered in the protection of hoods and N95 masks, Phyallen has an up close and personal view about how the virus has affected the community. The testing tent is divided into two sides: one for employees and the other for the community. Both groups must have their temperatures taken and cotton swab testing.

“This [COVID-19] is something that people need to take seriously because we see every day the people who are testing positive. One fact that I want everyone to know is that this is also hitting

people who are young, like in their 20’s,” said Phyallen, who has worked in the medical field for more than 13 years. “We will see a large group of that age come in for testing and many have not been changing their behaviors. Most will recover quickly from it, but the at-risk people they may have infected could have vastly different results.”

In the midst of the storm, Phyallen sees a light at the end of the tunnel and is thankful that people have responded so kindly. She and her colleagues are appreciative that the public has recognized the medical community for all their hard work, but Phyallen says she views the list of heroes as much bigger.

“I have been hearing of people who are doing random kind acts for the community or their neighbors. I really hope this brings out the best in everyone – not only now but when COVID-19 subsides.”

Phyallen, a graduate of Thornwood High School, has also been moved by the support she is receiving from her classmates and staff at SSC. “I can’t tell you how much I love this school. They make you feel comfortable and that you are not just a number. I have gotten to know the instructors and students in a real way and I can feel they care about me.”

Phyallen had to withdraw from several classes this spring as a result of her commitment to battling the pandemic. Because of the generosity of donors to the SSC Foundation’s COVID-19 Impact Fund, Phyallen will have her next classes and books paid for when she returns.

“Prior to receiving a surprise email from SSC saying that they would be able to help me, I had some sleepless nights. Thank you to my school and donors—I truly did not know what I was going to do without the extra support!”

Enyinnaya Omelogu

As a kid growing up in South Holland, Illinois, Enyinnaya Omelogu always wanted to follow in his parents' footsteps and join the healthcare community. He witnessed the humbling and fulfilling emotions his mother Deborah would experience. She told Enyinnaya, "joy and sorrow are not unusual on any given shift."

As a proud graduate of Thornwood High School, Enyinnaya didn't immediately pursue his calling when he enrolled at the local community college. After two years at SSC taking general education courses, Enyinnaya enrolled at University of Illinois Chicago (UIC) from 1999-2004 where his healthcare passion was reignited. Enyinnaya decided to return to his roots by applying to the college's Nursing Program.



"My goal was simply to become the best person that I could be."

Another reason Enyinnaya says he pursued nursing is because of its variety of pathways. He could focus on specialties like dialysis or family medicine. Other nursing options included anesthesia or emergency room nursing like his mother. As a visual learner, he excelled in SSC's hands-on Nursing Program curriculum. "The small class sizes were a great asset to me," said Enyinnaya, who especially enjoyed his clinical rotations shadowing nurses and other healthcare providers.

Enyinnaya completed his degree in 2009 and passed the NCLEX soon after. Further training was accomplished in the hospital setting where he collaborated with physicians and other medical personnel to coordinate patient care. He performed detailed assessments on patients, and learned how to provide compassionate care. Enyinnaya took advantage of his opportunities and continued to obtain additional credentials by earning his Master's Degree in Anesthesiology from Barry University in Florida.

Enyinnaya credits his community college education for giving him an opportunity to combine his general studies and nursing education at two different times in his life at a more affordable cost. "The return on investment allows nurses to provide compassionate care for others and still enjoy a fulfilling lifestyle."

Armed with three degrees, Enyinnaya was able to smoothly transition from Registered Nurse (RN) to Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA). He is currently employed at NorthStar Anesthesia. He works with surgeons and other medical staff to provide anesthesia for patients undergoing medical procedures. Enyinnaya often thinks of his mother while paying his experiences forward. He serves as a preceptor to nursing school students as well as anesthesia students/medical students, teaching them the inner workings of anesthesia in the operating room.

Moreover, Enyinnaya continues to pay it forward in more than one way. He started a scholarship in memory of his cousin Chima, who passed away after a long fight with cancer. Because of the phenomenal nurses who took care of his cousin, Enyinnaya thought it would only be appropriate to fund a nursing education scholarship. He established the Chima Omelogu Memorial Fund at SSC in 2017 by raising monies with friends. The goal of the scholarship is to fund four \$1,000 scholarships for nursing students annually.

Enyinnaya says "making a difference in someone's life is priceless." Or in his case, making the difference in several lives.

GOVERNOR PRITZKER VISITS OPENING OF COVID-19 TESTING SITE AT SOUTH SUBURBAN COLLEGE'S MAIN CAMPUS IN SOUTH HOLLAND



South Suburban College was chosen as a COVID-19 testing site by the Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA). Illinois Governor JB Pritzker visited the site on its opening day of testing. The testing tents were set up near the college's Fitness Center, utilizing the spacious parking lot and secluded roadways for drive-thru testing. The site remains open daily from 8 a.m. – 4 p.m. and testing is available to anyone with COVID-19 concerns.

SSC DONATES SUPPLIES AND SHIELDS TO LOCAL HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS



Face shields made in the SouthWorks Maker Lab at South Suburban College's Oak Forest Center were donated locally.

SSC donated supplies and masks to local healthcare providers. The College's Allied Health & Careers and Nursing Departments gathered a significant range of N95 masks with respirators, surgical masks, filters, gloves, gowns and personal protection kits for area hospitals. Additionally, during SSC's facility closure, staff at the SouthWorks Maker Lab within the College's Oak Forest Center were granted limited access in order to produce face shields.

"Our healthcare faculty took the initiative to make supplies available and our Maker Lab managers have committed to organizing the project to 3D print and assemble protective face shields to help protect our community," said Dr. Lynette Stokes, SSC President. "All of these items were donated to local agencies and hospitals. I'm so proud that our institution is able to do some small part to help keep our local healthcare workers safe."

CARES ACT AND NEW TAX DEDUCTION FOR ALL TAXPAYERS

In order to help alleviate the economic devastation caused by the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, Congress enacted the Coronavirus Aid Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) which distributed relief checks up to \$1,200 per taxpayer. Among its many provisions is a new universal deduction for charitable contributions. Taxpayers who don't itemize may now deduct up to \$300 per year in charitable contributions. Congress has granted this universal nonitemized "above the line" charitable deduction so that all taxpayers can deduct at least some of their donations. Taxpayers should itemize only if all their personal deductions, including charitable contributions, exceed the standard deduction. The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA), which went into effect in 2018, roughly doubled the standard deduction.

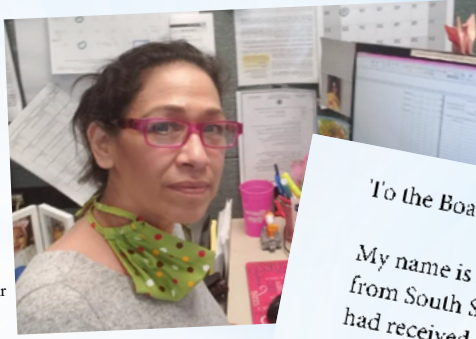
